

West Hills College Community Education and Concurrent Enrollment Classes

Westside Institute of Technology (WIT) is a collaborative project of West Hills Community College District and K-12 districts in the areas of Firebaugh-Las Deltas, Golden Plains and Mendota Unified School Districts. The mission of the WIT is to improve the quality of life through quality of work, linking individual learners and employers through regional collaboration between career and technical education and business.

Pooling facilities and financial resources, WIT provides short-term job training for high-demand careers. Most of the classes are mobile and move from community to community so the market is not over saturated and students save on transportation costs. Many of the classes are taught in English and Spanish. Working with local employers, the Fresno County Workforce Investment Board and Economic Development Corporation, WIT seeks to identify jobs of the future and the skills needed by those who will fill those jobs.

With WIT now well established and its success documented one student at a time, the communities are better positioned to survive the drought and its economic impacts. The model of trust, cooperation, collaboration and pooled resources has worked well. While curriculum is provided or dictated at the discretion of the employer, proven and successful education methodologies to instruct that curriculum are already in place. WHCCD is outfitted with competent faculty and staff as well as industry-leading educational resources and world-class training facilities in Lemoore, Coalinga, and Mendota. In addition, the Coalinga-based Farm of the Future, a world class instructional facility with dedicated lab space, offers a wide range of training.
